

#### **REGARDING CONSENT...**

#### Consent is defined as a

#### "VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT TO ENGAGE IN SEXUAL ACTIVITY"

SITUATIONS WHERE THERE IS NO CONSENT

Complainant was incapable of consenting

Complainant said "no" either in words or through her behavior.

Complainant changed her mind.

Someone other than the complainant gave consent for her.

## UNACCEPTABLE DEFENSES FOR NOT GAINING CONSENT

Accused too intoxicated.

Accused believed that she was consenting.

# IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO TAKE REASONABLE STEPS TO ENSURE THAT CONSENT IS PRESENT BEFORE ENGAGING in SEXUAL ACTIVITY.
